Diabetes UK and Pharmacy Research UK are partnering to welcome applications for practice-based pharmacy research into diabetes.

Priority Research Area

Diabetes UK and Pharmacy Research UK welcome grant proposals focussed on any form of practice-based pharmacy research into diabetes, as understanding this area better is an area of clear importance to both Charities. We are looking for practical proposals exploring how pharmacy and pharmacists can support people with diabetes. This could include, but is not limited to:

- the role of pharmacy and pharmacists in better supporting people with diabetes;
- pharmacists' role in the early diagnosis of diabetes;
- improving medicines' optimisation and medicine safety;
- overcoming health inequalities within diabetes care;
- better understanding and supporting people with diabetes who have co-morbidities;
- improving the delivery of pharmacy service for people with diabetes;
- development of new patient facing pharmacy services for people with diabetes.

Both Diabetes UK and Pharmacy Research UK are committed to patient involvement in research and would expect to see this reflected in any applications. Applications to this scheme should not include basic pharmacological research.

1 December 2020 17:00 hrs (Committee meets in May/June 2021)

Application Assessment Process

All applications received under this partnership will be assessed through the Diabetes UK standard assessment procedure for Project grants and will be considered in competition with all other applications submitted to the Diabetes UK Project Grant round.

Applications will be expected to show evidence of patient and public involvement in all areas of the research process and will be assessed on following criteria:

- Potential difference the research will make to the experience of people with diabetes.
- Scientific excellence.
- Track record of the applicants.
- Value for money.
